About the Program

The Child Development program is designed to prepare an individual to transfer to a senior institution or to pursue employment in a preschool setting. The classes are offered both day and evening at the Decatur and Huntsville campuses.

How Do I Apply?

Everyone must submit an application for admission to either the Admissions Office on the Decatur campus or to the Huntsville campus. At that time, you'll receive further information on admissions requirements.

How Much Will it Cost?

Since the college does not have dormitories, the only other costs will be for transportation to and from class and books and supplies.
