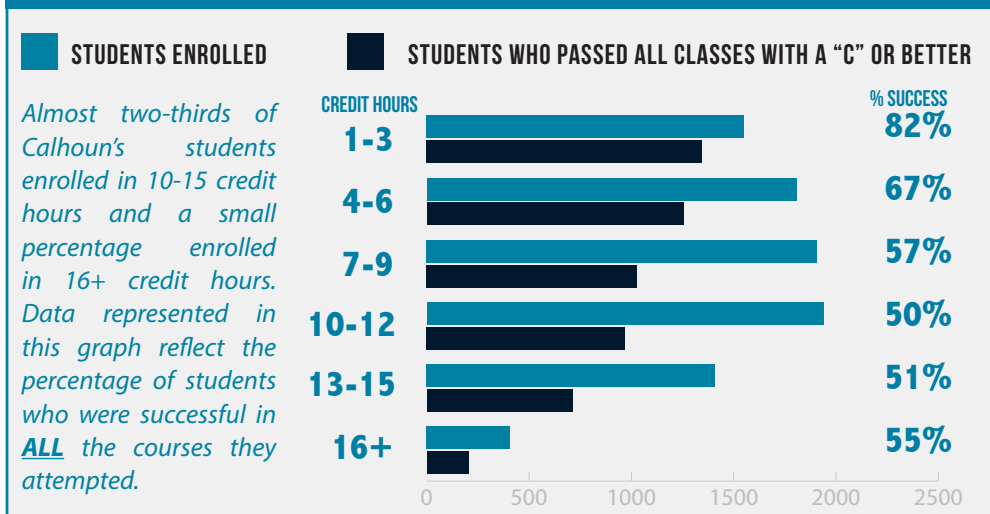

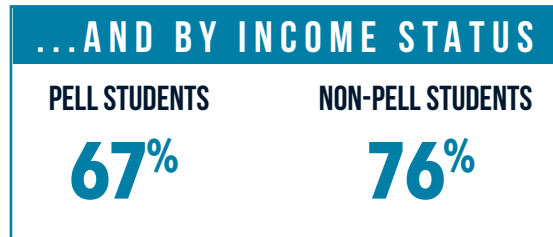
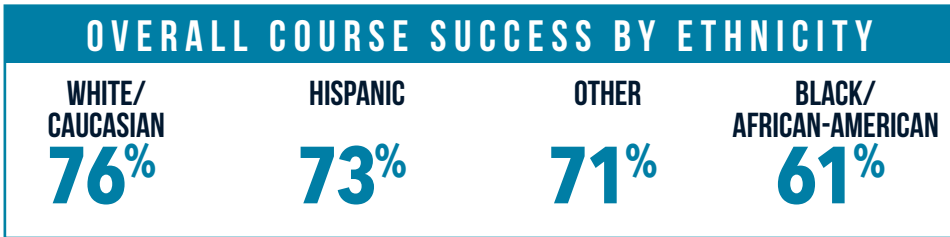

CREDIT HOURS ATTEMPTED VERSUS CREDIT HOURS EARNED

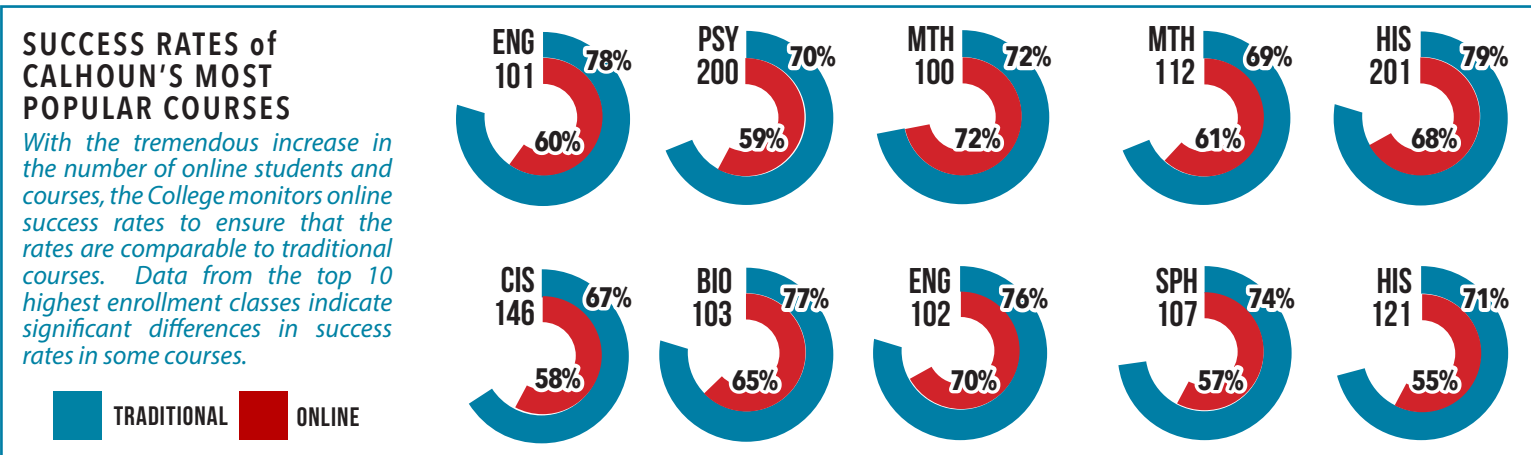

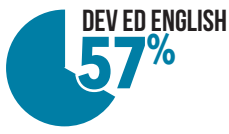
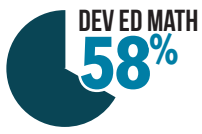


ONLINE LEARNING

Almost half (**46%**) of our students were enrolled in at least one online course in Fall 2018.



DEV ED SUCCESS RATES

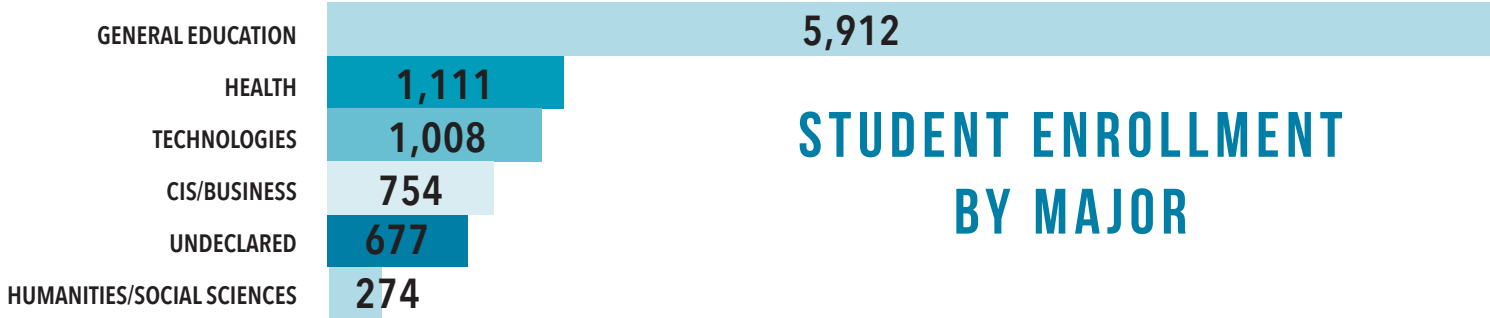
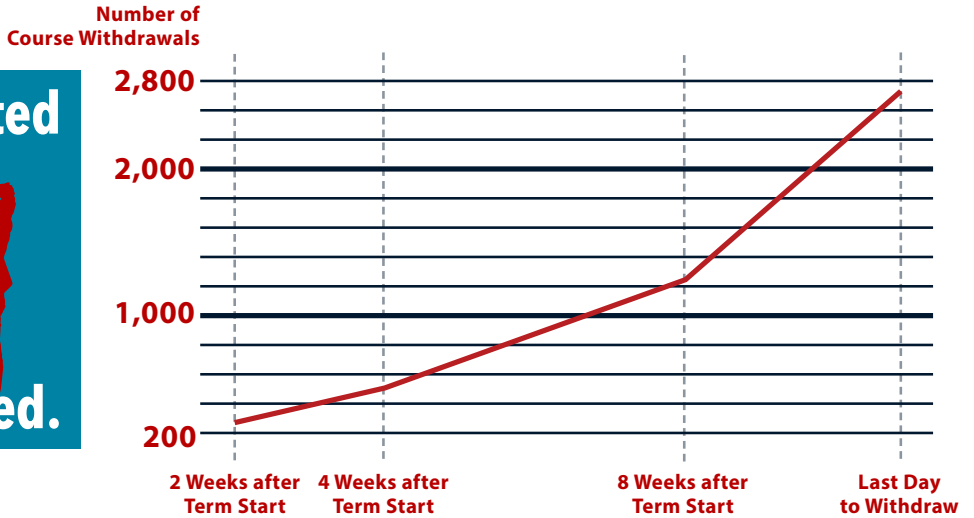


In Fall 2018, **797 students** were enrolled in Developmental Math and/or English.

COURSE WITHDRAWALS

College data indicate that within the first two weeks of **Fall Semester, 2018**, students had withdrawn from **259 courses**. By the last day to withdraw (**11/14/2018**), the number grew to **2690** withdrawn courses.

1,202 students completed the semester... with ZERO credits earned.



FALL '18 GRADUATES
A total of **467** students received certificates and/or degrees in Fall Semester, 2018. The Associate of Science Degree in Advanced Manufacturing was the most popular degree awarded at 214.
