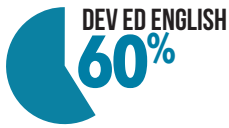


ONLINE LEARNING

Almost half (**48%**) of our students were enrolled in at least one online course in Spring 2019.



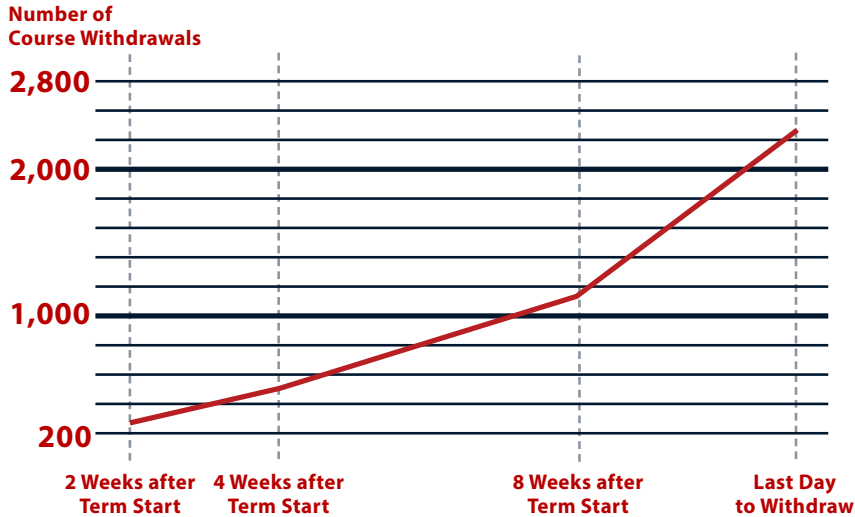
DEV ED SUCCESS RATES



In Spring 2019, **450 students** were enrolled in Developmental Math and/or English.

COURSE WITHDRAWALS

College data indicate students had totally withdrawn from **225** courses within the first 2 weeks of **Spring Semester, 2019**. By the last day to withdraw (**4/9/2019**) the number grew to **2,478** totally withdrawn students.



1,093 students completed the semester...
with **ZERO** credits earned.

Based on all students, Fall 2018 to Spring 2019 retention was **70%**
