Calhoun Community College evaluates student success using a number of different measures throughout students' academic careers. These measures were selected based on college, state and federal performance indicators.

- 1. Graduation Rate, 150% of normal time:** Graduation rate for first-time, full-time credential-seeking students, in 150% of normal time (normal time = two years; 150% = three years). (US Department of Education Integrated Postsecondary Education Data system (IPEDS) data). **The IPEDS 3-year graduation rate is the chosen graduation rate metric on file with SACSCOC.**
