# Adjunct Faculty Salary Schedule 

## Academic Courses

Please note: Appropriate salary adjustments must be made for classes with open labs. For example, if a class carries three credits and the part-time instructor meets two hours of lecture and the remainder of the classes spent in an open lab setting with a lab assistant or someone other than the instructor, the part-time instructor should be compensated for lecture time only. In a physical education activity, the course may carry one credit hour and require two contact hours. In this case, the instructor should be compensated for two hours. See specific areas for examples.

## Science Division

Science faculty compensation is based on the academic scale. Therefore, adjustments should be made accordingly to accommodate two-hour lecture/four-hour labs, stacked lecture courses with separate labs, etc.

## Health and Physical Education

As before, compensation for physical education activity courses is based on contact hours. Credit and contact hours for health courses are equal. The academic scale should be used for both HED and PED courses.

## Technology and Business Professional Service

Vocational/technical instructors cannot work more than 15 clock hours per week. In addition, a 15-week timeframe has been used as the basis of the pay scale. Some vocational/technical instructors may be compensated on the academic scale. Credentials must be in field and meet required criteria.

To calculate the compensation for a part-time vocational/technical instructor, follow the guidelines listed below.

1. Determine credentials
2. Determine number of hours instructor will work per week.
3. Multiply 15 weeks by the number of hours by the rate of pay.

> Contact (Clock) Hour

Certificate $\$ 30$
Associate \$32
Bachelors \$35
Example: $\quad 15$ weeks X 15 hours per week X $\$ 30$ (Associate) $=\$ 6750$
15 Weeks X 10 hours per week X $\$ 32$ (Bachelors) $=\$ 4800$

Please note: The hourly rate is to be used for calculating a contract amount and should not be quoted as a per hour rate of pay.

## Health Sciences Services

Health science instructors will follow the pay scale below. If more than one instructor is responsible for teaching a course, each instructor must be entered in the computer system. In addition, the percentage for the course responsibility must be entered. Compensation must be adjusted for each instructor involved in team teaching.
