Minimum Requirements to Apply

- Rising High School Senior (must have completed 11th grade)
- ACT Reading Score of 18 or higher
- Current high school GPA of 3.0 or greater
- Completed ENG 101 English Composition I and MTH 100 Intermediate College Algebra with a grade of C or higher
- Valid Driver's License and Reliable Transportation (must be able to drive to campus and clinical sites)

Meeting minimum requirements does not guarantee acceptance. The number of students admitted to the DA program each year is limited and therefore the application process is competitive. Application components are verified and scored by the DA Admissions Committee. Top ranking applicants are offered enrollment in the program which begins summer semester, Monday, May 20th, 2024.

Students who are accepted into the CCC Dual Enrollment Dental Assistant program are making a commitment to a three-semester program of study – beginning the summer following their junior year in high school.

- During the summer term, students must be able to meet for classes Monday Thursday on the Decatur campus from 8:00 a.m. until as late at 4:30 p.m. Students are also responsible for 2 hours of online pre-recorded lecture each week and reading assignments.
- During the fall semester, students must be able to attend on-campus DA classes on Mondays from 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and on Wednesdays from 8:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. On Tuesdays and Thursdays students must be able to participate in clinical learning experiences at assigned local dental offices from approx..8:00 5:00 p.m.
- During the spring semester, students must be able to attend assigned clinical learning rotations at local dental offices on Tuesdays and Thursdays from approximately 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and attend an on-campus class on Wednesday from 8:00 until 11:00 a.m. There are an additional nine (9) hours of weekly online lecture for which students are responsible.

Funding for the Dual Enrollment Dental Assistant program is provided through the Calhoun Community College Workforce Scholarship grant and currently covers tuition, fees, textbooks and uniforms. The amount of funds each year is determined by the availability and scope of state distributions. The cost of a required health exam, TB testing, background check and drug screening are the responsibility of the student.
